Rochester Rifle Club New Membership Procedure

New applicants MUST be currently active members of the National Rifle Association (NRA) and must provide proof. Proof of NRA membership must contain your name, your address, your membership number and your membership expiration date <u>on the same</u> <u>document</u>. The following are the only items accepted as proof of NRA membership:

- 1) A current NRA address label from one of the NRA publications (America's 1st Freedom, American Hunter, or American Rifleman).
- 2) A letter or FAX from the NRA containing the above required information. To obtain this letter or FAX from NRA membership, call 1-800-672-3888 and follow these instructions: Dial the number, do not press any numbers and wait for the switchboard operator. Ask to be connected to an NRA membership representative in Fairfax, Virginia. Ask that representative to send you a letter or FAX with your membership information. Be sure to tell him to include all 4 items (name, address, membership number and expiration date).

New applicants MUST also be sponsored by a currently active RRC member. Those needing help with sponsorship may visit the club during an activities to meet with an officer or director. See our online calendar (http://calendar.rochesterrifleclub.org). Alternatively, contact the membership director for other options.

Applications without proof of NRA membership and sponsorship will be returned!

Once this application is accepted by the membership director, you will be sent an invitation to a New Member's Orientation class and a copy of the range rules. After successful completion of that class, payment will be accepted and you will receive your keycard to the club. Please also know that **new applicants will be required** to sign a waiver to release RRC from any liability before allowed to join. Spouse and junior members must also complete a basic firearms safety course to use the range and become an RRC club members. This requirement can be fulfilled by showing evidence of military service, attending a DEC hunter safety training class, a BSA gun safety course or by attending a firearm safety course at RRC. Attending a New Member's Orientation class is also an acceptable fulfillment of this requirement.

General Information about the club

The Rochester Rifle Club is a civilian shooting organization affiliated with the NRA since 1914. The RRC provides an indoor shooting range for air guns, 22 rimfire rifles and handguns of most calibers (magnum loads are not allowed). The range has 12 positions with target stops at 10 meters for air rifle/pistol and 50 feet for firearms. The club is a membership, non-profit organization. All the officers and directors are volunteer and are not paid. The club is available 24/7 for member's casual shooting except during the periods when there are regularly scheduled programs. New members are encouraged to check out our various programs which include several junior programs for boys and girls 12 years and older, the Community Pistol League (CPL), and Sporterifle (22 rimfire rifle competition).
