# SAFETY FIRST AT THE ROCHESTER RIFLE CLUB

For over 102 years, we have promoted safety on our ranges years ago we had access to some outdoor ranges as well as the former Commercial Street range.

WHEREVER we were, safety was the emphasis. Through our participation in NYS Hunter Safety (over 40,000 trained) and our RRC Youth programs (hundreds of youth trained in Basic Marksmanship and Safety), and our New Member Safety Training & Orientation, we reach almost 200 new people each year.

And yet..... a small number of people still manage to forget about our range rules. Here are a few reasons WHY some folks have lost their membership with the RRC.

 Pointed a handgun towards the sides (not down range). The violator lost his membership for this and a few other reasons.
 Shots were fired at target not at

the proper distance, so the shots

rifle on the RRC range. Damaged backstop... Billed violator for damages... Ouch... The ONLY rifle allowed is a .22.

5) Used Shotgun wads or pellets. (Shotguns not allowed on RRC range)

- ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

So...... You thought maybe your son or daughter or grandchild would someday inherit your prized shotgun, rifle or handgun. Hmm. Not so fast. Police in Buffalo have made plans to seize guns of a person within days following their death. Obviously, 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment advocates are upset about this as much of the law protecting one's guns are not shared with the survivors. ### Newsletter Dedication from Mike

This Newsletter is dedicated in memorial to Fred & Winifred Aumock.

Background: In 1947 Bud & Dorothy Warden were teaching Hunter Safety classes two years before NYS Gov. Dewey signed a Hunter Safety Law. They had high standards. In 1964, Fred Aumock took over Hunter Safety at the RRC and ran six sessions <u>each</u> fall, winter, spring and summer.

Fred was also a strong advocate of the Sporterifle program (begun at the RRC by Olin LeRoy in the 1940s). With his contacts, Fred helped build the Sporterifle League - which ran across NYS and northern PA. In 1967, when the RRC was without our own indoor range, Fred helped with arrangements at the Goodman Street Armory, the U of R, and R.I.T. so Sporterifle could continue. As soon as the RRC completed the building of the Winton Road Indoor range in 1975, Fred scheduled <u>9 Hunter Safety</u> classes!

Concurrent with his RRC duties, Fred was NYSR&P Association Sporterifle Director 1973-1976 and NYSR&P Assoc. - President 1977-1979. Fred was a RRC Director for many years including a stint as RRC President ending in the 1984 / 1985 year. "Winnie" (Winifred) his wife was RRC Membership Director for over a decade.

Around 1982, Don Drexler witnessed over 32,000 Hunter Safety cards from Fred's files. These files were then turned over to the DEC. Fred passed away in 2006 at the age of 86. Winnie passed away in 2008.
