Rochester Rifle Club New Membership Procedure

New applicants need not be sponsored, but if sponsored by a current member or gun shop the sponsor will receive a \$10 finder's fee when the applicant joins.

Once this application is accepted by the membership director, an invitation to a New Member's Orientation class and a copy of the range rules is sent. After successful completion of that class, payment is accepted and a keycard to the club is issued. Please also know that new applicants will be required to sign a waiver to release RRC from any liability before joining. The waiver can be viewed at: http://waiver.rochesterrifleclub.org.

Although not required for membership at the RRC, membership in an organization that supports the shooting sports such as Civilian Marksmanship Program (C.M.P.), USA Shooting, Shooters Committee on Political Education (S.C.O.P.E.), US Concealed Carry Association (U.S.C.C.A.), Gun Owners of America (G.O.A.), Firearms Policy Coalition (F.P.C.), New York State Rifle & Pistol Association (NYSR&PA), and /or The National Rifle Association (N.R.A.) is recommended.

Spouse and junior members must also complete a basic firearms safety course to use the range and become an RRC club member. This requirement can be fulfilled by showing evidence of military service, attending a DEC hunter safety training class, a BSA gun safety course or by attending a firearm safety course at RRC. Attending a New Member's Orientation class is also an acceptable fulfillment of this requirement. For youth wishing to join the Youth Precision Program, each youth must complete the NRA Basic Rifle class series (offered once each late summer / early fall).

General Information about the club

The Rochester Rifle Club is a civilian shooting organization affiliated with the NRA since 1914. The RRC provides an indoor shooting range for air guns, .22 rimfire rifles and handguns of most non-magnum calibers. The range has 12 positions with target stops at 10 meters and 50 feet. The club is a membership, non-profit organization. All the officers and directors are unpaid volunteers. The club is available 24/7 for member's casual shooting except during regularly scheduled programs. New members are encouraged to check out our various programs which include several junior programs for boys and girls 12 years and older, the Community Pistol League (CPL), and Sporterifle (.22 rimfire rifle competition).
